SCHOOL EXCURSIONS

Serengeti Trip

The children of standard V, VI and VII were among the privileged ones to be a part of the annual expedition. This year the children were taken to Ngorongoro, Serengeti and the surrounding areas including Museum and the Snake park.

ARUSHA MUSEUM

The first place we visited was National Natural History Museums in Arusha. Collections found at the museum were Paleontological and archaeological collections from different sites from Tanzania. Students paid keen attention to the taxidermist unit watching live a taxidermist professional skinning and mounting a lion. Students got to touch and observe the reaction of the "Touch me not" plant in the mini botanical garden with live endemic, threatened and useful indigenous plant species of Tanzania.



THE NGORONGORO CRATER

The Ngorongoro crater circuit was completed in one day. we were lucky to see more than enough animals in the crater area like Gnu, Zebras, buffalo, hippos, baboons, bucks and wildebeest. Vibrant birdlife was also seen in the crater flamingos, white stork, Marabou stork, swallows, vulture, buzzards besides other colorful birds. Eagles and a marabou stork were uninvited guests during the lunchtime at Ngorongoro picnic area.

TANGA FRESH

Students of std I & II went on a tour of a leading dairy Tanga Fresh situated in Tanga Region. Students learnt how they processed milk and also enjoyed having yoghurt or milk. They learnt Math practically by observing packets of 250ml and 500ml. 'Shelf life' was a new term introduced to young children.



AIRPORT & WEATHER STATION

Students of std. III visited Airport and Weather Station. A memorable photo of students posing with an airplane as a backdrop was taken. For them seeing an aeroplane at an arm's length was a thrilling experience. They also got to witness the landing of an aeroplane.

Mwahako Zoo

Students of std I & II visited the ZOO where they got to see animals like crocodile, lion, giraffe, tortoise, etc. There were also some fun rides for children. Although it was a wet day yet children enjoyed a day out with their favourite animals.



The students learnt practically about instruments like wind sock and Anemometers which could calculate the wind speed and direction of the wind where it's going.

SCHOOL EXCURSIONS

SERENGETI

The climax of the trip was Serengeti game reserve where we were fortunate enough to feast our eyes on a lioness walking along the bus. And a hyena right in front of the bus at night. While returning to hostel after dinner we saw a lion lurking on the road in the vicinity of the hostel. We also happened to see a lioness trying to prey on a leopard and her cubs and the smart forest Rangers saved the leopard as they are at the verge of extinction. Besides that, we saw amazing animals like zebras, rhinos, hippos basking in the sun in the water, a herd of elephants, giraffes, antelopes, gazelles, etc. Moreso throughout the trip deer, antelopes, zebras, giraffe, vultures, baboons were seen in abundance.



SNAKE PARK

On the last Day we visited to the Meserani Snake Park and Maasai Museum. There our students learnt, how do snakes defend themselves, where they live in nature, and what they eat. There was also a bird sanctuary in the park. They also saw different kinds of crocodiles and turtles in the Snake Park. The brave hearts got a chance to pose for a selfie while holding a non-poisonous snake.

MAASAI MUSEUM

We explored the Maasai culture in depth at two places Maasai village located deep down on the floor of Ngorongoro crater and Maasai Museum AT Snake Park.

In the Maasai museum the Maasai told everything about their culture and even explained the students step by step how they build their houses. They also learned more about their special holidays and rituals. The biggest difference in both Maasai village and Maasai museum was that, students got a little bit deeper understanding into the way of life of the people, and their traditions whereas in the village they participated in activities like lighting fire, using wood, learning dancing steps and visiting the home and KG school of the Maasais. At the Maasai museum students dress themselves up in traditional Maasai attires, girls adorning themselves with their traditional jewelleryes and boys holding spears and weapons and enjoyed the photo shoot.

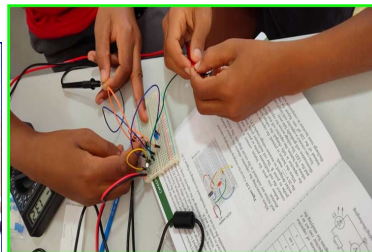


Annual Science Exhibition

STD I & II

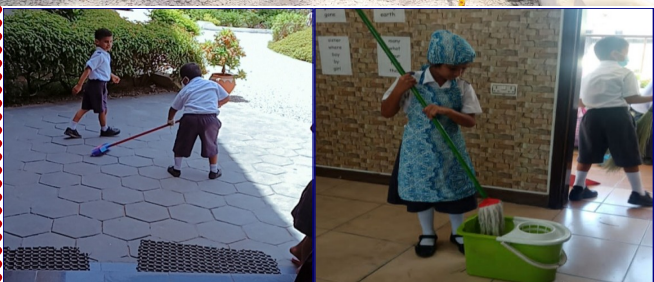
Children of std I and II donned a Chef Cap and got down to work as cooks on Friday. They made Sandwiches and Fruit Salad with the help of their class teachers.

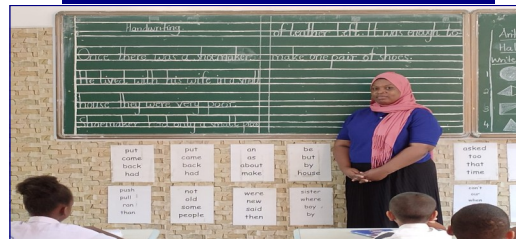

The other speller is then given a chance to spell the word that the other speller spelled incorrectly. If they spell it right, they are given one more word. If they spell the second word correctly, they are declared the winner. Even if a child does not win, it's important to remember that a spelling bee competition can result in a range of benefits ranging from higher confidence to better vocabulary. The valuable learning outcome of spelling bee results in the children gaining competency over vocabulary and this allows them to excel at reading and writing.

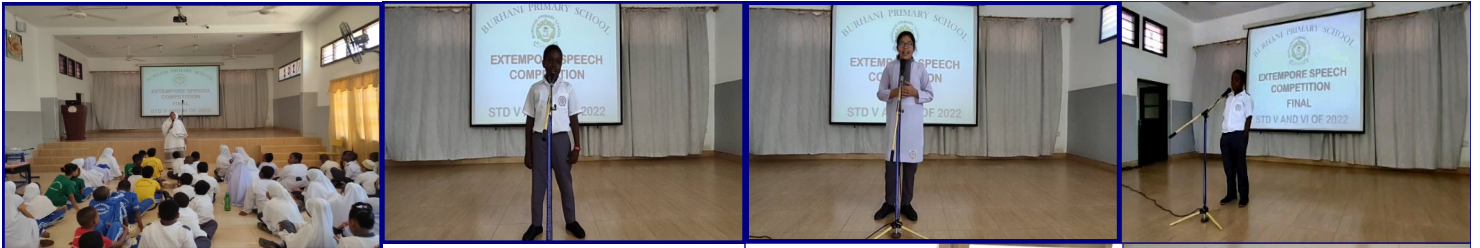
LIBRARY
